From April 12 to April 16, 1993, a meeting was organised by the Systeemgroep Nederland (Dutch Systems Group) and sponsored, among others, by the International Federation for Systems Research. It was part of a series, organised since 1979, to discuss topics that develop out of efforts to apply ideas from systems thinking or have cropped up in various disciplines. These meetings are designed to deal with questions that do not yet have an established slot at other conferences on systems and systems research (such as the EMCSR).

The topic in 1993 was inspired by a number of general observations. In many areas of study there is a plethora of theories but they, unfortunately, all fail dismally when used as a basis for controlled change. Data seem collectable only with a specific purpose in mind, that is, it does
